Survey of Wesleyan Students

Conducted by the students in GOVT372, "Political Communication in a Polarized Age" Fall 2019 Semester

Fielded September 28-30, 2019 via email

N=700

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This survey was conducted (written and analyzed) by the students in GOVT372, "Political Communication in a Polarized Age," under the supervision of Prof. Erika Franklin Fowler for a class project during the Fall 2019 semester. Wesleyan's IRB reviewed and deemed the research to be exempt on September 24, 2019. The survey was fielded via Qualtrics through an email distribution to 2,933 student email addresses in the Wesleyan directory. Survey respondents were allowed to skip questions. A total of 700 students completed the survey between September 28-30, 2019. The margin of error is plus or minus 3%.

Results presented here are unweighted (see Slide 3 for a demographic comparison of our sample to the population of Wesleyan students).



Our sample has slightly more women and students of color than the Wesleyan population overall as reported on Wesleyan's webpage (<u>https://www.wesleyan.edu/about/glanceatwes.html</u>; click <u>here for an archived version</u> of that page), but the representation varies by different subgroups. For the Class of 2023, for example, our sample has more women but fewer students of color than the class as reported on the same page.


Q2 - Which of the following do you think is the most important problem facing the U.S. today?


Q3 - How closely do you follow news stories about politics and public affairs?


Q4 - Where do you prefer to study?


Q5 - With which side of Usdan do you identify?


Q6 - Are you an international student?




Q11 - Regardless of who you may support, which of the Democratic candidates do you think has the best chance to defeat Donald Trump in the general election?*


Q13 - Would you support or oppose replacing private health insurance with a government-run health insurance program?


Q14 - Would you support or oppose making all 4-year public colleges and universities tuition free?


Q15 - Where do you think each of the following politicians stands on the following issue: Replacing private health insurance with a government-run health insurance program


Q16 - Where do you think each of the following politicians stands on the following issue: Making all 4-year public colleges and universities tuition free


Q17 - Is there a policy stance X that would be a deal-breaker such that you would not vote for a candidate who disagrees with you on X but agrees with you on all other issues?


Q18 - When considering your vote in a general election, on how many of the issues would a candidate need to align with you in order to earn your vote?


Q19 - Whether or not you were eligible to vote in the 2016 U.S. presidential election, which of the following candidates did you support in the general election?


Q20 - If you had to choose one, whose policies more closely align with your political beliefs?


Q21 - Did you take part in the Ban the Box Movement?


Q22 - What is your current level of involvement with Ban the Box?


Q23 - When there is an important issue you want to raise attention to on campus, to whom do you go in order to garner support? Check all that apply.












Q30 - Do you have any close friends who are on the opposite end of the ideological spectrum?


Q31 - Would you date someone who is a member of a different political party than you?


Q32 - Are you registered to vote in the United States?


Q33 - Are you registered to vote in Middletown or someplace else?










Q39 - Would you consider your family to be...

America's Issue Concerns by Population Density

This table shows the issue that survey takers found the *most* important sorted by the density of their hometown.

Urbanites' most pressing issues relative to the overall averages were race relations and gun violence, while they were significantly less likely to list the environment as the most pressing problem relative to other groups.

Rural students were most likely to select the environment as the most important problem and least likely to select race relations compared to the average of all students.



Specific Question: Do you support replacing private health insurance with a government run health insurance




- Overall, the majority of respondents have engaged with someone on the opposite side of the political spectrum in the past month


Deal-breaker Issue Polarization

At Wesleyan, people who have a deal-breaker issue are half as likely to consider dating someone from another Political Party. While people without a deal-breaker issue are divided more evenly





Deal-Breaker Issues by Gender



The most common deal-breaker issues were the environment and reproductive rights, both by a large margin.

On the whole, women were likeliest to have a deal-breaker issue (57% of women; 47% non-binary people [n=34]; 45% of men).

After the top two, the most frequent issues listed were LGBT rights, gun control, racial justice, immigration, and healthcare.



Establishment vs. Anti-Establishment Action Choice by Candidate



This graph shows the proportion of people who chose establishment (administrator, professor, WSA) vs. anti-establishment (student group, social media, organizing protests) people/actions to raise attention and garner support for an issue, by which candidate they supported.

As one would expect, Sanders supporters are most anti-establishment; curiously, Biden and Warren supporters are equally anti-establishment. Buttigieg supporters are most amenable to the establishment.

Respondents who said the number one issue facing the United States today is health care, supported 'replacing private health insurance with a government-run health insurance plan' <u>less</u> than respondents who said election security, environment, race relations, or reproductive rights were the number one issue.

Knowledge on International Affairs

Comparing international students and American students, a higher percentage of international students correctly guessed the Prime Minister of the UK (Boris Johnson). Also, American students were more likely than international students to select the "I'm not sure" option.
